

GCCCE/ICCAI 2001 Camera Ready Paper/Poster Format Information (for English Paper)

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This is an example of the format of the final paper for the GCCCE/ICCAI 2001 Conference. It contains the camera ready formatting information. 1 Introduction

We would like all authors to follow the guidelines provided. These guidelines are the same for Full Papers, Short Papers and Posters.

- Full Papers should have a length of **6-8 pages**
- Short Papers between **2-4 pages**
- Posters should be **1 page**.

Do not forget to use the reviewer comments when preparing your final paper. Please note that an accepted paper cannot be included in the Proceedings without at least one author registering for the conference. Please send your electronic paper(s), in MS-Word or PDF format, to gccce2001@src.ncu.edu.tw by APRIL 15, 2001. Do NOT send the paper through surface mail, please send by E-mail. Your attached files should be named as follows.

<Papercode-Yourlastname.doc> or <Papercode-Yourlastname.pdf>

For example: <F001-Yang.doc> or <S001-Yang.pdf>

The Papercode is in the email you received when your paper was accepted.

2 Page Size

All material on each page should be formatted on A4 (210 x 297mm) or 8.5" x 11" paper, single-sided, written in a one-column format and should fit within a rectangle of 160 x 250mm, centered on the page, beginning 24mm from the top of the page.

3 Text

3.1 Title and Authors

The title (Times Roman, 24-point, bold font), author's names (Times Roman, 12-point, bold font) and affiliations (Times Roman, 12-point, italics font) run across the full width of the page and should be centered. We also recommend phone numbers and e-mail address(es). For two or more addresses, use superscript characters like "*", "**" to mark the names with the same address, and write the respective addresses below the name, starting with the corresponding superscript character, like in the following example:

Title Here

Author A* Author B and Author C***

** Authors' A and C's affiliation and email*

*** Authors' B affiliation and email*

For Chinese papers, it is necessary to also provide an English title after the Chinese abstract.

3.2 Abstract and Keywords (This does not apply to posters.)

Every submission should begin with an abstract of at most 200 words, followed by a set of not more than four keywords. The abstract should be placed under the title, author names and affiliations. The abstract should be written using Times Roman 10-point size characters. The word 'Abstract' should be omitted. Insert the abstract text in a 120mm wide, centered text area.

For Chinese papers, it is necessary to also provide an English abstract in addition to the Chinese abstract. Please seek the help of an English native speaker in preparing your English abstract if necessary.

Keywords should start with the word "**Keywords:**" also using Times Roman 10-point size characters. The actual keywords following this word should be bold.

3.3 Normal or Body Text

Use the Times Roman 10-point font for the content of your paper. Only use Sans-Serifs or non-proportional fonts for special purposes, such as distinguishing source code from text. Both left and right margins should be justified, not ragged.

3.4 References and Citations

References should appear as a numbered list at the end of the article, and should be written with the same character type as the Body text, that is 10-point Times Roman font. References should start with an un-numbered section heading "**References**". References should be cited in the main text by an Arabic number in square brackets. English references should be ordered alphabetically by the first author, and Chinese references should be order by the key stroke count of the first author's name. For URL references, the title of the html page should be shown, followed by the URL address. See examples at the reference section.

References should be published material accessible to the public.

3.5 Page Numbering

Do not include page numbers in your submission.

4 Sections

The heading of a section should be in 14-point Times Roman, bold font and start with a number followed by the initial letter of the first word capitalized. Sections should be numbered. Keep two blank lines above a section heading and a sub-heading. Put one blank line under a heading and sub-heading.

Each paper should start with a section called:

1 Introduction

and end with a section called:

x Conclusions

After this section the references should follow, as described previously.

4.1 Subsections

The headings of subsections should be in 12-point Times Roman bold font with the initial letter of the first word capitalized.

4.1.1 Subsubsections

The heading for subsubsections should be in 10-point Times Roman bold font with the initial letter of the first word capitalized. Please do not use more than three header levels.

5 Figures and Tables

Figures and tables should be inserted at the appropriate point in your text in **black and white**. Make sure they are clear and with enough contrast to appear correctly in the final proceedings. Each figure and table have to be numbered and captioned in 10-point Times Roman font and should be centered. Figure captions should be placed *beneath* the figure. Table captions should be placed *above* the table.

6 Conclusions
